WASHING INSTRUCTIONS



Washing instructions for leather gloves

All unlined gloves are exposed to exudation especially on the ball of the thumb and the fingertips. This exudation hardens the leather until it breaks. HELD gloves are equipped sweat proof but anyway you can extend the durability with the right care.

- 1. Clean your gloves in tepid water by using mild soap or special leather cleanser
- 2. Don't use fabric softener or bleach
- 3. To avoid residues of the cleanser you should wash the gloves with clear water afterwards
- 4. Put the glove on when still wet and clench your fist to bring it into shape again
- 5. Wrap the glove into a dry cloth and squeeze it (no mangling!)
- 6. Dry the glove exposed to air (no heating, sun or dryer)
- 7. Put on the dry glove and knead it to make it soft
- 8. Treat the glove with a leather care product

Washing instructions for textile gloves and gloves with membrane

- 1. Wash the gloves by hand with mild soap
- 2. Don't use fabric softener or bleach
- 3. No dry-cleaning
- 4. To avoid residues of the soap you should wash the gloves with clear water afterwards
- 5. Don't squeeze or mangle the wet gloves
- 6. Dry the glove exposed to air (no heating, sun or dryer)

TIP:

If only the inner lining of a membrane glove should be cleaned, you can use water with a little mild detergent without getting the outer shell (leather or fabric) wet.



Impregnation:

An impregnation does not affect the function of the GORE-TEX® functional material. Well impregnated gloves are dirt- and water-repellent. A drenched outer-shell causes a loss of heat inside. Well done impregnation protects also against cold. The outer shell comes ready impregnated from the supplier. If the impregnation loses its effect (if water doesn't roll of anymore) you should treat the gloves with an impregnant.
